THE IRISH MATHEMATICS LEARNING SUPPORT NETWORK (IMLSN)

Mission Statement

The aim of the IMLSN is to act as an informative community of practice for all those with an interest in the provision of mathematics and statistics support at third-level education in Ireland. The IMLSN strives to provide training and support to members through the sharing of ideas and best practice. It also aims to provide a mechanism for the provision of opportunities for collaborative research and development in the area of Mathematics Learning Support (MLS). The IMLSN espouses a scholarly approach to mathematics learning support that is expedited by an annual workshop and online forum to promote, discuss and evaluate best practice in Mathematics Learning Support nationally and internationally. The IMLSN seeks to foster links with other similar networks internationally e.g. the sigma network in the UK, and to enhance research collaborations between its members and international colleagues with research interests in the areas of mathematics learning support and mathematics education. The ultimate aim of the IMLSN is to ensure that students in Higher Education Institutions on the island of Ireland benefit from the best possible mathematical support and education that MLS can provide.

How can interested parties get involved with the IMLSN

People can get involved in the IMLSN community of practice in several ways and at different levels:

- 3. People can participate in the annual IMLSN workshops by attending and /or presenting papers on their work in the area of MLS.

The purpose of the website and mailing list is to keep all members of mathematics learning support in Ireland abreast of developments in MLS nationally and internationally. This keeps members informed about conferences and seminars in mathematics education in Ireland and the UK. It also serves as a repository for links to online staff and student resources. There is also an IMLSN Newsletter that is issued electronically.

This year we will held our 9th annual workshop at UCD on Friday May 29th.

Each conference has a keynote speaker and invited experts from the mathematics education community in the UK and/or Ireland.
