Initiative Title	ALTITUDE – The National Charter for Universal Design in Tertiary Education
Aims/ Objectives	<p>The ALTITUDE project set forth three key outputs:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Development of the ALTITUDE Charter to initiate a national discussion on its adoption and support. 2. Production of a Position Paper outlining charter development and proposing how it may be adopted and utilized in the system. 3. Rationale and Identified Needs	Despite a robust national policy commitment to a UD approach, evidence suggests that this commitment is not always consistently reflected in the institutional strategies and or practices in tertiary education sector. This discrepancy raises concerns about the sustainability of the UD approach within tertiary education sector.

<p>Summary</p>	<p>The project involves a diverse array of stakeholders, including national bodies, HEIs, and ETBs encompassing an extensive collaboration with a 27-strong cross-sectoral partnership. Workload and responsibilities have been distributed among ten working groups at different project stages.</p> <p>The project's goals, outlined in the working draft, are to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide a vehicle for HEIs and ETBs (institutions) to declare their intent to make incremental and sustainable progress towards embedding a universal design approach, in line with their resources, culture and strategy. • Promote the development of institutional policies, structures, and strategies which support the sustainable implementation of a universal design approach across tertiary institutions. • Anchor a culture of shared responsibility for universal design, access & inclusion across the tertiary sector by developing organisational structures which foster an 'everyone's business' approach to inclusion. • Develop a more unified language of and commitment to a universal design approach across the tertiary sector, fostering greater opportunities for partnership, collaboration and shared learning.

- Support institutions to work towards goals in a range of key national and international strategies concerning universal design, student success, sustainability, and inclusion.

Signing the ALTITUDE Charter will signal an institutions' positive intent to make gradual and lasting strides in embracing a UD approach. Acknowledging diverse institutional stages and resources, the Charter promotes steady progress aligned with each institution's strategies and values. Committing to the Charter involves establishing a remit in each institution to oversee the implementation of UD across the four pillars outlined in the Charter as a singular new committee or within existing structures.

The development of the ALTITUDE Charter is informed by international literature on UD in educational contexts and extensive consultation with staff and learners in Irish tertiary education. The Charter recommends key strategic foundations and scaffolding for institutions to support the sustainable implementation of universal design across the learner experience.

These meetings progressed consultations and charter draft stages. Technical Report (subcommittee working group) met regularly to progress the Technical Report outlining the charter development and proposals on how it may be adopted and utilised in the system. <p>Consultation(s)/ Draft Stages:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Phase 1: Internal consultation with the 50+-member expert group (Dec 22-Feb 24). The first consultation - National UD Charter team. UCD Inclusive Toolkit from 2018 (reviewing the 4 pillars; teaching & learning, student supports & services, physical environment, digital environment) reviewed, 162 gaps identified. From this consultation draft 1 of the charter was created. Phase 2: A 2-day national consultation event built into the AHEAD conference featuring 200+ students and professionals from FET and Higher Education (Mar). Following phase 1 and 2, an early draft of the charter was developed to inform the next phase of consultation. Phase 3: 20 focus group staff consultations facilitated locally in ETBs and HEIs around the country by project team members, providing direct feedback on the draft Charter (May to July). Phase 4: 15 learner focus groups and approx. 1350 learner survey responses providing direct input from FET and HE students on what would make their experience more inclusive and accessible in each pillar Phase 5: Consultations/ Stakeholder Dialogue: The National UD Charter project Lead and Collaborative Lead held various key stakeholder groups and invited further consultation opportunities. Each of the stakeholders named below participated in ALTITUDE Charter consultations prior to the next phase of the draft process. (QQI, IUA Registrars, THEA Registrars, ETBI – Inclusion & Strategy Committee, SOLAS, National Forum, NTO, DAWN Network) Phase 6: Development of final draft of the Charter and Technical Report, considering the findings of phase 4 and 5 consultations in updates made.
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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Launch of the Charter and Technical Report as a national discussion in March 2024, with the toolkit following by UCD partners in June 2024. These releases were intended to give institutions an early look at the Charter and encourage internal dialogue to consider formal adoption and implementation. • Given the need for deeper dialogue with representative groups and policy makers, it is estimated that adoption of the Charter will formally become early 2025. <p>UCD Toolkit</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Student & Staff consultation data facilitated by the National Charter team assisted in informing the re-development of the UCD Toolkit for Inclusive Higher Education Institutions (Unlocking Inclusion Toolkit) released June 2024.
What resources did you need?	National Access Plan PATH 4 Phase I funding allowed for lead and partnering institutions to utilise funding to contribute staffing hours and data analysis resources. Expertise within the Charter team was utilised and considerable progress in development has been made considering the funding was not substantial. The significant progress has been facilitated by an extraordinary collaborative effort from the cross-sectoral team, and the distribution of workload and responsibility to 10 different working groups at different stages of the project to date.
Has it been evaluated? How successful has it been?	At every draft phase, the ALTITUDE project team (52 colleagues with UD/UDL expertise across FET/ HE evaluated the Charter. The content of the Charter has been evaluated via staff/ student consultations.
